I received 3 packages from you in one day; one sent to Camp Reynolds where I was in the states, of course the candy was no good; one had the films in it, and one had the snapshot album. Either the films (they were 620's) or the album was dated July 29 it looked like, do you remember about what time you sent them? about the comic books, if you send them 1st class, individually, I'm sure they will come air mail. I also got two letters dated aug. 4 today, that's pretty fast don't you think?

I'm glad everyone thinks the  
War will be over soon, sorry I  
can't agree with them. Even if  
it is I'm afraid I won't see home  
again for at least 18 more months.

Sorry but I can't tell you what  
is wrong with my patients.

The cut under my eye didn't  
leave a scar and didn't bother  
me much. I don't think I've  
been sick a day yet, of course  
everyone gets a little diarrhea  
every now and then.

I'm sorry but I meant to tell  
you not to send my box  
kiosk because it will be awfully  
hard to carry around, especially since  
I'll probably be making a lot soon.

2 think we are in for a big storm in a little while, the lightning is really something outside, lights up the whole place.

I will take some pictures tomorrow, a friend has a 620 camera and I have the three rolls you sent me. I think I told you that my best buddy Lewandowski got separated from me a couple of days ago. I told you when I first got here that I am here on temporary duty only.

Well guess I'd better sign off now, will write again soon, send comic books as I told you.
